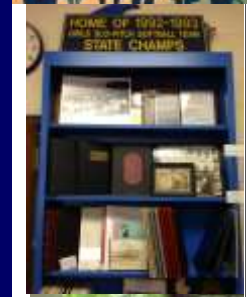

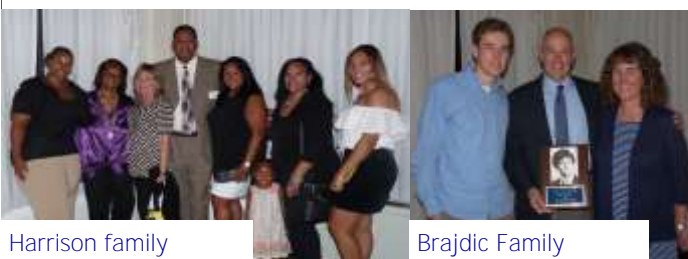

Life on Craneing Road

Almost everyone who grew up in Wickliffe knew where Craneing Road was located. Maybe it was because it was one of the last residential streets before Wickliffe melded into Euclid; maybe because many of us passed it on the way to the freeway entrance, or maybe because many of us made a late night visit to the nearby drive-in theater or Denny's restaurant.

Back in the 1950s and into the early 1960s, Craneing Road had an abundance of school-aged kids on the street. Bruce Gamiere remembers that there were so many Wickliffe students living on Craneing that they nearly filled a whole school bus themselves. The nearby landscape was very different during those years. Instead of a freeway, the surrounding area included a creek, woods, and railroad tracks. In addition, there were businesses such as a golf driving range and putt-putt course, a trailer park, a drive-in theater, and Cleveland Crane and Engineering Co.

Donna Shank Sadlik '69 remembers Craneing as being a family friendly street; everyone watched out for each other. She remembers being able to hear the noon whistle blowing at the Cleveland Crane which not only signaled lunch for the factory workers, but also time for the kids to stop playing outside and go home for lunch. Many of the kids also loved the railroad tracks and would line coins up on the rails and wait for **a train to flatten them. In addition, Craneing's** sloping street provided a great hill for roller skating.

During one season, the drive-in theater installed a speaker by the fence

that separated Craneing from the drive-in's property. This allowed residents to enjoy movies in the comfort of their own backyards. The speaker was eventually removed after someone complained. However, on peaceful summer evenings, **the movies' soundtracks wafted into the residents' yards much to the enjoyment of many of the kids and adults alike.**

When the Craneing kids explored the woods and creek behind the drive-in, their imaginations **turned the woods into "Buffalo Trail" and the creek into "The Land of a Thousand Streams."** **Of course, most kids couldn't resist their curiosity of the Wickliffe Cemetery which was at the edge of the woods.** This setting alone created many a dare and probably as many nightmares!

The nearby driving range would pay the neighborhood kids a nickel for each golf ball they retrieved outside the course property. This proposition created a stiff competition among the kids who were eager to earn money to buy candy or baseball cards.

During this time, the families on the street were able to negotiate with the City of Wickliffe to acquire the property behind the drive-in to create their very own neighborhood park. Families came together to clear out the wooded area. The city installed a swing, slide, merry-go-round, and even a baseball diamond where the kids played for hours. There was even a Craneing Road baseball team that competed with kids from Euclid and other areas.

At the end of East 289th street was the train depot, and many a hobo would jump off the train when the train stopped at the depot. The parents on the street gave strict warnings to the kids to stay away from the hobos. Kathy Farinacci Fitz remembered being frightened by these strangers on the street. One Thanksgiving, **there was a knock on her family's door. There stood one of the hobo's asking for food.** Her mother graciously removed the leg from their turkey and handed it to him. Mike Fitz, who lived on Lloyd Road next to the then lumber yard and railroad tracks, remembers his mom giving some beggars a container of instant coffee grounds and sandwiches. Karen Keckler-Schafer remembers her grandmother making them peanut butter sandwiches. Barbara Bader had an odd experience when one of the hobos came to her house and asked for food. Her mom gave the man a ham sandwich and sent him on his way. When they went outside later, they found that the hobo had not eaten the sandwich, but instead, had torn it in little pieces and made a trail down the driveway and up the street.

On the north side of the railroad tracks was a brick yard company. When the brick yard company burned down, the hole where they dug for the clay to make the bricks remained. The kilns were left behind and the hobos used them for shelters. Later the city used the hole to dump trash and garbage after it was incinerated in the Euclid incinerator. The Euclid Incinerator created so much soot that the resident had to put extra protection on their windows, and the air quality became a problem.

On the south end of Craneing, there was a saw mill which later became a gas station, and on the other side was a large house (once believed to be the residence of Mr. Craneing) that was an alcoholic rehabilitation facility. Later it was torn down and became Denny's restaurant.

Once the freeway was under construction, Bruce remembers checking out the earth moving equipment pretending he was part of the crew doing his part in making way for the new highway. Once the freeway was underway, the driving range, putt-putt course and trailer park were demolished.

It was such a close-knit group that they even had a neighborhood newsletter. Karen Keckler-Schafer and her best friend Stefanie would type the weekly Craneing Road News using carbon paper. The ladies interviewed neighbors, relayed news, told jokes, etc.

For those that lived on Craneing Road there are an abundance of fond memories. Thank you to all that shared theirs
